	Shrove Tuesday	This is the day before Lent. The word 'shrove' comes from the word 'shriven' (which means to confess or say sorry). It is usually celebrated by making pancakes, to use up all the rich and fatty ingredients before the fasting of Lent begins.			
	Lent		repre dese Chris	Lent is the period of forty days before Easter. It represents the forty days that Jesus spent in the desert when he was tempted by the devil. Christians mark Lent by giving up rich foods and drinks.	
	Ash Wednesday		Lent begins on Ash Wednesday. The name comes from the tradition of putting a small cross of ash on a person's forehead when they visit church.		
	Palm Sunday	Lent	Holy Week	Palm Sunday marks the day when Jesus entered Jerusalem on a donkey and people lined the road with palm leaves to celebrate his arrival. In church services, Christians receive small crosses made from palm leaves.	
	Maundy Thursday			This is the day when Jesus ate his 'last supper' with his disciples, before being caught by the Romans. In some Church services, priests wash people's feet, as this is what Jesus did for his disciples before the meal.	
4	Good Friday			Good Friday is the day that Jesus was crucified by the Romans on a hill outside Jerusalem. It is marked in some places by the carrying of a cross through the streets, before the Good Friday church service takes place.	
	Holy Saturday			The last day of Lent and the one full day when Jesus was dead.	
	Easter Sunday	One of the most important days of the Christian year. It is the day that Jesus rose from the dead (called the 'Resurrection') and defeated evil. Church services traditionally begin with the lighting of twelve candles around the church.			
	Easter Monday	The day after Easter Sunday. It is traditionally celebrated in some countries with egg rolling competitions.
